- Hand deliver the ballot in the sealed envelope to the EnerStar office at 11597 IL Hwy 1, Paris. by 4:30 pm on Friday, March 27, 2020.
- Hand deliver the ballot in the sealed envelope to the Annual Meeting of Members on Saturday, March 28, 2020, at Crestwood School in Paris.

Please note: Do not include any other correspondence in the ballot envelope such as payment on your electric bill.

Candidate for Voting District A, Representative District 1

the southernmost district. He has served as Chairman of the EnerStar Board since 2012. Dan is an accredited Director through NRECA.

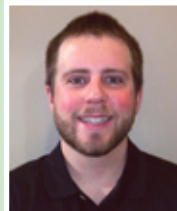
