About the Election for the Board of Directors IFSTIONS?

We are excited about our upcoming annual meeting and can't wait to see everyone there. The Official Notice of the Annual Meeting will be mailed to all active members in late April, so keep an eye on your mailbox. Along with the notice, you will receive details about the candidates running for an open seat on the EnerStar Board of Directors, a voting ballot for your representative district, and a pre-addressed return envelope. Ballots can be returned three ways:

• Mail your ballot in the pre-addressed envelope. There is no postage necessary. Mail-in ballots must be received by Friday, May 31, 2024 by 4 p.m. Do not include any other correspondence, such as a payment for your electric bill.

Hand deliver your ballot in the sealed envelope to the EnerStar office at 11597 IL Hwy 1, Paris, IL, by 4 p.m. on Friday, May 31, 2024.

• Hand deliver your ballot in the sealed envelope at Annual Meeting of Members on Saturday, June 1, 2024, at Paris High School, Paris.

Ballots will be counted by co-op members serving as Election Inspectors. The director results will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

At the meeting, members will also vote on two proposed bylaw changes. Detailed information will be included in the official notice but can also be found at www.enerstar.com.


